

Sorrows Track Ends the Season with New Records at the Final Two Meets

The incredible track season ended with the Kids 4 Kids Relays and the 2nd Annual Saint Cassian Meet. Since there were no championships involved, our athletes were able to try events they would like and the results were impressive.

In the Kids 4 Kids Meet a couple of school relay records were set when Nick Torres, Ajamo Carraby-Jones, Akhir Crenshaw, Maurice Tabron broke the one year old medley record and Sheu Maphosa, Jeremiah Lunis and Akhir Crenshaw set a new TurboJav relay mark. Of course, they were 7th /8th Grade records as well.

Other medalists were Christopher Schmidt, Joe Schmidt, Brendan McKeon and Fionn Tynan, 2nd in the 3rd & 4th Boys 4 x 100, and Nyla Edwards, Charlotte Marion, Teresa Pollard and Emma Torres, 2nd in the Girls 7th & 8th 4 x 100. In the Boys 7th & 8th, the team of Oliver Karbownik, Jeremiah Lunis, Nick Torres and Ajamo Carraby-Jones won the gold. In the Novice Girls 4 x 100 for 3rd & 4th graders Christina Paul, Caylee Brice, Bella Borde and Mary Kola placed 2nd.

In the TurboJav relay Stephanie James, Amelia Benjamin and Emma Torres took silver in the Girls 5th & 6th event while the boys' team of Jared Edwards, Taona Maphosa and Aryan Sabnekar took silver for the boys. In the Long Jump the team of Charlotte Marian, Teresa Pollard and Alyma Karbownik captured 1st for the 7th & 8th Grade Girls competition. The boys' team of Jared Edwards, Harold Fullilove and Sergio Marian placed 2nd in the Boys 5th & 6th.

Finally, in the Shot Put relays the 3rd & 4th girls took 2nd with a team of Lori Kola, Zenya Stewart-Mitchell and Zayda Gordon. Then, Lori helped the 5th & 6th grade girls to a 2nd when she teamed up with Stephanie James and Amelia Benjamin. The boys' teams took two gold medals when Taona Maphosa, Declan Tynan and Parker Hamilton out-threw their 5th & 6th competition and Sheu Maphosa, Akhir Crenshaw and Dukens Dossous put away the 7th & 8th grade competition.

Days later the 2nd Annual Saint Cassian meet took place at Hurrell Field.

In the 3rd & 4th grades, Parker Hamilton twice broke his class record for the 4 pound shot, adding nine feet to the old record from 2106. He then added two-and-a-half feet to the 6 pound class record. Not content with breaking the 3rd grade class record once, Maudie Grace Lomuscio did it again and has now broken the original record by more than a minute! Then Fionn Tynan took out Jared Edwards' 3rd grade record by 2/10 of a second, just a few seconds ahead of 2nd grader Joe Schmidt.

Other successes included Jared Edwards and Emma Torres who continued to tear up the 5th & 6th grades fields in the 1600. Alyma Karbownik doubled with a 1st place in the Long Jump and 800. Amelia Benjamin and Teresa Pollard took the 5th & 6th Girls Shot and the 7th & 8th Girls Shot. Charlotte Marion won the TurboJav and placed 2nd in the Long Jump. Ajamo Carraby-Jones and Nick Torres went one-two in the 1600, solidifying their places as the 3rd and 4th best in OLS history. Later Ajamo won the 800 and Nick the 400. Isabel Sabnekar won the 3rd & 4th Girls 400. Parker Hamilton won the Boys 3rd & 4th TurboJav. Jared, again, won the 200 as did Mitchell Purnomo in the Boys 3rd & 4th 200.

Other medalists included Hana Yamaoka in the 7th & 8th TurboJav, Stephanie James in the 5th & 6th Girls Turbo, Jordan Ince with a 100 and 200 double in the Girls 7th & 8th and Amelia Benjamin in the 5th & 6th 200. Aiden Benjamin won silver in the Boys 3rd & 4th 1600. In the 5th & 6th Boys bronze medals

were won by Harold Fullilove in the 200, Sergio Marian in the 400 and Declan Tynan in the 100. Harold was 2nd in the Long Jump, too. Fionn Tynan and Joe Schmidt went 2nd and 3rd in the 3rd & 4th Boys 800.

The relays concluded the meet and the season. Mitchell Purnomo, Aidan Benjamin, Parker Hamilton and Fionn Tynan placed 2nd in the 3rd & 4th Boys Medley. Emma Torres, Amelia Benjamin, Alyma Karbownik and Caroline Schmidt placed 2nd in the Girls 5th & 6th with the team of Ciara McKeon, Stephanie James, Molly Donohue and Maudie Grace Lomuscio following in 3rd. Three consecutive gold medals were won by the 5th & 6th boys with Harold Fullilove, David Purnomo, Max Ince and Jared Edwards, the Girls 7th & 8th team of Nyla Edwards, Jordan Ince, Charlotte Marian and Hana Yamaoka and the Boys 7th & 8th team of Teresa Pollard, Jeremiah Lunis, Ajamo Carraby-Jones and Nick Torres.

And so, the book on one of the most successful teams in OLS' twenty year history of track closed with wins at our three major meets – OLS, Holy Trinity and Union Catholic – and a close 2nd at a minor meet. Moreover, the future looks to be just as successful.
